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# Introduction

"Connections" was created in 2004 by a group of agencies in New York City, who belong to the Young Men of Color Coalition (YMCC), an initiative led by People of Color in Crisis, Inc.. The YMCC brings various organizations together to collaboratively work to reduce the rate of HIV infection among Black and Latino young men and their peers who may or may not identify as having same-gender desires.

## We Are:

People of Color in Crisis, Inc. is an organization of dedicated Black gay men committed to honoring, affirming and nurturing the rich and numerous connections we share with each other. Our mission is to build community and improve the quality of life and health among African-American and Caribbean gay men, men who have sex with men and bisexual men through advocacy, education and direct services.



## The Agency:

People of Color in Crisis, Inc. was founded in 1988 by a group of African-American and Caribbean gay men. As many of these men watched their friends, lovers, and family struck down by AIDS they were determined to do something about it. The agency's original mission was to provide the community with education, support and resources on HIV. Over the years POCC has offered a wide variety of programming in response to the ever changing nature of the HIV/AIDS epidemic and the issues important to Black gay men. In the last couple of years, the agency's mission has expanded to include all aspects of Black gay men's lives.

Today we offer a wide array of services. Our programs range from providing support for members of the community who are infected or affected by the HIV virus, to providing a safe space for community members to Drop-in. We are working towards telling our stories through research, advocacy and public policy.

## THE YOUNG MEN OF COLOR COALITION

In 2001, People of Color in Crisis, Inc. was funded through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to serve as the lead organization to mobilize organizations and create the Young Men of Color Coalition (YMCC).

The Young Men of Color Coalition brings organizations together from across Manhattan, Queens, and Brooklyn who provide services to Black and Latino Young Men Who Have Sex with Men (YMSM). This 5-year initiative has been commissioned to address and reduce the soaring HIV infection rates, to jointly tackle behaviors that are detrimental to the positive development among Black and Latino YMSM through coalition-work and youth leadership development.

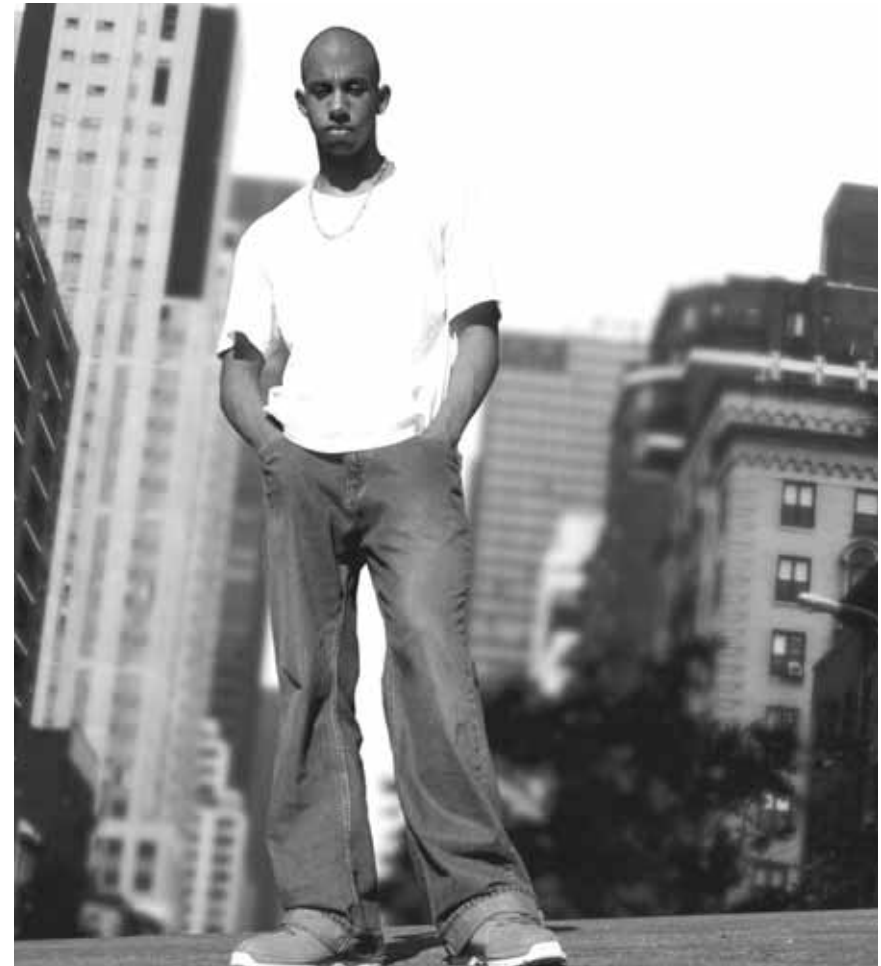
## AIP / ACQC

# STIs

Hey you, don't turn the page!! I am glad you are reading this because what I am about to talk about is important and **CAN SAVE YOUR LIFE**. So, pay close attention. I am going to talk about what signs to look for that might indicate that you could have a Sexually Transmitted Disease/Infection (STD) or (STI). STDs have been with us for a long time and they are not going anywhere anytime soon. So here's the **411** on STDs.

There are plenty of different STDs. Most have different symptoms and names that are sometimes difficult to spell or pronounce. STDs are caused by a bacteria or a virus, and are passed from one person to another through close, sexual activity including vaginal, anal and oral sex. In other words, some STDs are transmitted through skin to skin contact, and other STDs are transmitted through the exchange of vaginal fluids, semen and blood. Bacterial STDs are the ones that can be cured if treated early on, so don't sit around for the STD to magically go away. It won't. With viral STDs, the virus may stay in your body forever, but the symptoms (i.e. blisters, warts) can be treated.

# STIs

## So, how do you know if you have an STD?

Well, sometimes many people do not have symptoms, and the symptoms are not always the same for both young men and women. But if you do, this is what you might notice.

YOUNG WOMEN	YOUNG MEN
Yellow/greenish/brown discharge or funny smell from your vagina	A white watery drip or yellow or greenish discharge from your penis
Pain in the pelvic area (area between belly button and the sex organs)	Burning when peeing
Burning when peeing	Peeing a lot
Peeing a lot	Swollen testicles
Bleeding from your vagina when it is not your regular period.	Sores, bumps or blisters near penis, rectum or mouth
Pain deep inside your vagina when you have sex	Flu-like feeling, fever, chills and aches for more than 10 days
Sores, bumps or blisters near your vagina, rectum or mouth	A swelling or redness in your throat after unprotected oral sex
Flu-like feeling, fever, chills and aches for more than 10 days	
A swelling or redness in your throat after unprotected oral sex

I hope from reading this, you now know that STDs are NO JOKE. I am not trying to scare you. I just want to give you information that can keep you safe and help you make healthy decisions, especially if you are thinking about having sex or if you are already "doing it." Once you start having sex, it is your responsibility to see a health professional to make sure that you don't have an STD. Remember, you can prevent becoming infected with an STD by not having sex or by correctly using latex condoms every time you have sex.

Remember the only sure way to know if you have an STD is to get tested, so if you have any of these symptoms, **GO GET TESTED!**

# Suicide

## WOULD HURTING MYSELF BE THE SOLUTION . . . . ?

If you are feeling like hurting yourself now, please stop long enough to read this. It will only take a few minutes. I do not want to talk you out of your bad feelings, but I do know what its like to be in pain. I don't know who you are, or why you are reading this page. I can assume that you are here because you are troubled and considering ending your life. I wish I could talk to you face to face, but since that is not possible, please continue reading.

I have known a lot of people who have wanted to hurt themselves or end their lives, so I have some small idea of what you might be feeling. I won't argue with you about whether you should continue or stop, but I assume that if you are thinking about it, you feel pretty bad and must be going through a rough period. I want you to know that you are not alone and that there are places where you can go and get help.

Before you turn this page, I want you to read about the some of the symptoms of a person who may be thinking about committing suicide:

- **Feeling depressed, angry, or hopeless;**
- **Feeling that there is no solution to what you are going through; and feeling tired of trying;**
- **Noticing that your personality has changed from happy to sad;**
- **Thinking of hurting yourself;**
- **Talking about suicide; or**
- **Thinking about creating a suicide plan or writing a suicide letter.**

# DEPRESSION

## "WHY DO I FEEL SO SAD ALL OF THE TIME?"

You must've turned to this page because you're concerned about depression or you feel that you actually are depressed. Hopefully, after you read this you might reach out to people who can help you. Also, know that because you may be depressed, it does not mean you are weird or crazy. Sometimes many of us get depressed just about anything, but in time we feel better.

There is a type of depression, clinical depression, which is serious and requires closer attention. Being clinically depressed is a medical condition that affects the day-to-day living of the person and it's sometimes called the "silent sickness" because there are really no visual symptoms. We can not really determine what causes depression because the symptoms and situations vary with each individual. I want you to read the list below and see if any of these warning signs apply to you:

- **Do you feel worthless at times?**
- **Are you constantly tired?**
- **Do you frequently find yourself crying?**
- **Are you having trouble sleeping or do you sleep all of the time?**
- **Has your activity at work or school slowed down?**
- **Do you feel unmotivated?**
- **Do you find you eat too much or don't want to eat at all?**
- **Do you use alcohol or drugs to forget your problems?**
- **Do you think of hurting yourself or others?**

After reading this list, if you relate to these warning signs, it might be helpful for you to talk with someone. You've come to the right page, so I can direct you to a few agencies that help young people like you who may be depressed. Turn to the following pages for information and support:

## I THINK I MIGHT BE GAY OR . . . . . BUT WHAT IF I DON'T KNOW FOR SURE?

The world can be a tough place for a young person. You're in one of the most confusing times of your life. The rules are changing. Your body is changing. Your moods are all over the place, and you're expected to act more and more like an adult. You may have new adult responsibilities like volunteer work or a part-time job. You might be even going to college and/or choosing a career path. It's a rough time.

As if this isn't enough, you will have to deal with making friends, and learning who your real friends are. Sometimes you may feel like you are completely alone trying to figure things out, and all of a sudden, the sexuality issue comes up. This issue may come up for some young people earlier than others, but trust me, it always comes up. If you're a gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgender young person - or if you think you might be gay or wonder if you are - it's even more confusing, because probably no one has ever prepared you to deal with this situation.

You might ask yourself, "Am I normal because I am having these feelings?" THE SHORT ANSWER: Yes. Questioning your feelings about your sexuality is completely normal. In addition, being gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender is as natural, normal, and healthy as being heterosexual. You might also ask, "How will I know for sure if I am gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender?" Again, the short answer is: You'll know, when you know. It could take a while and there's no need to rush. Just know that you are not alone.

While you are going through this period of figuring out where you stand, it would be helpful to find someone whom you can trust, who might help you understand what it is that you are going through. There are also various agencies in your area that may help answer any questions you may have. These agencies have programs for gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and questioning youth that you might want to join to make new friends who understand and can give you additional support.

## Remember these golden rules and know that you will be O.K. in the end:

- One: Being gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender or questioning is completely normal. Don't let anyone tell you otherwise;
- Two: You're not alone. Right now, there are tens of thousands of other young people who think or wonder if they are gay. Many wonder if they're the only ones feeling this way, and are trying to find someone to talk to about it;
- Three: It takes time to know who you are. It's okay to be confused. It's okay to be unsure about your sexuality and your feelings, and it's okay to take your time to figure it all out. There's no need to rush.

# Relationships

## WHAT'S LOVE GOT TO DO WITH IT.....?

We have lots of different relationships in our lives: with friends, family, teachers, doctors, work mates, boyfriend/girlfriend/partner and so on. The kind of relationship I want to talk to you about is the boyfriend/girlfriend/partner type.

Deciding whether to have a boyfriend/girlfriend/partner may be a big decision. Sometimes we may feel that everybody around us is in a relationship. This can be tough especially if you feel like there is pressure for you to be in one as well. There's no hurry. Remember that it is OK to take your time. Being happy with yourself and your life can help you feel content whether you are in a relationship or not. Being "single" offers a great opportunity to get to know yourself better. This may be helpful in thinking about what you may want if you choose to have a boyfriend/girlfriend/partner.

However, let's say that you have met the "one" and the two of you have decided to make it official. What happens next? Well, I want to give you some important rules that you may want to discuss with your boyfriend/girlfriend/partner that can help you have a healthy relationship. Here they are:

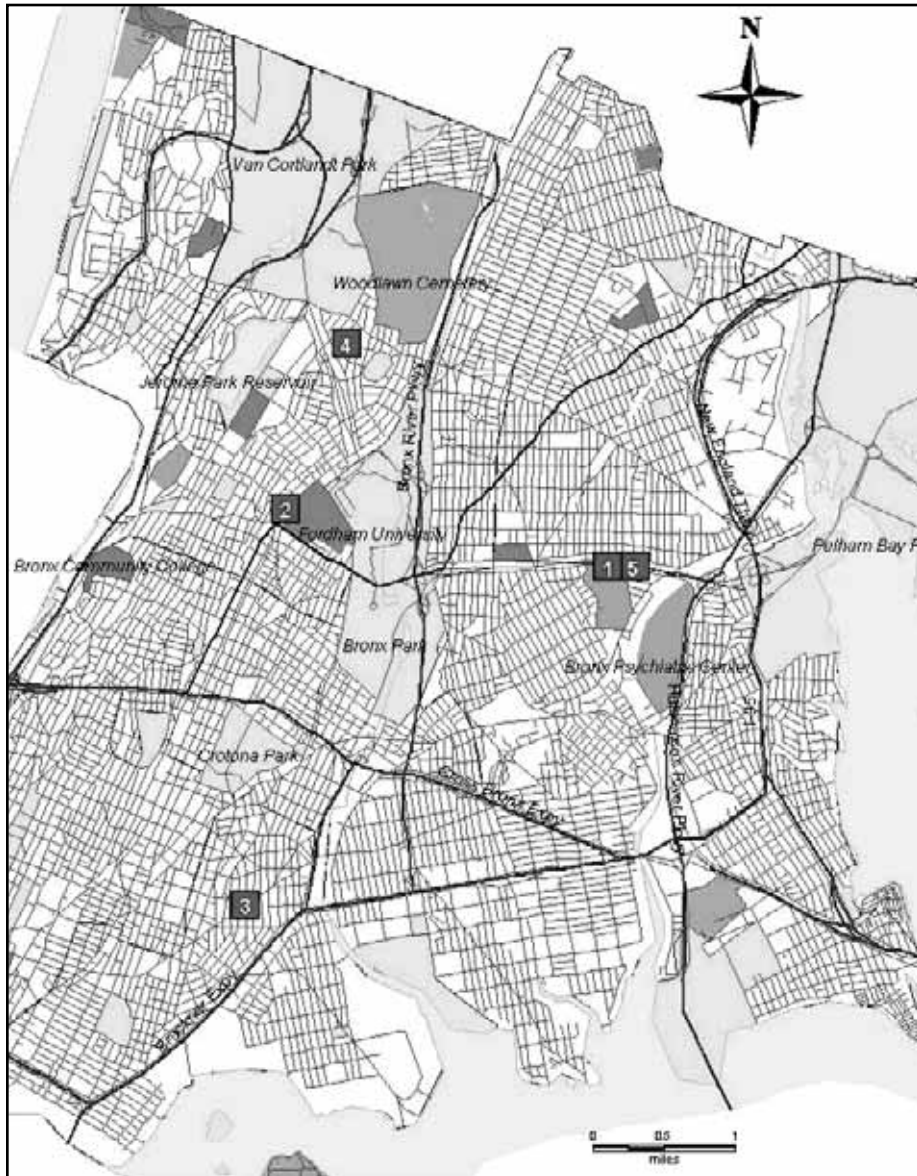
1. Sometimes relationships work well and are easy going, and other times they can be hard and you may wonder if they are worth it. If the two of you are fully committed to make your relationship work through the good times and the bad times, then you are headed in the right direction;
2. Always be honest with each other in communicating your thoughts, feelings and needs in a clear way. This will help you in the future in dealing with conflicts, making decisions and solving problems;
3. Sometimes when two people decide to be in a relationship the "sex issue" may come up at some time. This may make one or the two of you nervous and unsure about what to do. If you or your partner are feeling nervous and unsure, it is best not to do anything that later on you might regret. Again, there's no need to rush into having sex. Explore other ways to express love and affection for each other and discuss the "sex thing" in more detail. Remember, having a healthy relationship doesn't mean you have to have sex. But whatever you do, whether it's kissing, touching or having sex, it should always be something that you both want to do. No one should force you into any type of sexual contact. In fact, this is sexual assault, and it is a crime that should be reported to the police.
